CAMPBELL LAUNCHES HER CAMPAIGNING FOR THE STATE ASSEMBLY 2010

Maggie Campbell officially announces her campaign for the State Assembly 2010, at a Launch Party held in her honor, December 27, 2008 at 5 p.m. at Butler's Coffee located at 40125 West 10th St. Palmdale, California.

"It was my intention to launch my 2010 State Assembly campaign sooner. Out of respect for the Democratic process, I postponed the event to allow more time for the ballot counting to be completed. I am coming out of the political starting blocks early to ensure that the Republican elected in 2008 - should he seek re-election, does not prevail in 2010." states Maggie Campbell.

Mrs. Campbell will give her

first speech in support of her 2010 campaign, outline her political platform, mix and mingle with her supporters and introduce special guest speakers. She will hit the campaign trail early and begin raising campaign funds.

Mrs. Campbell, a well known Pastor, Political Activist and the Founder of the Inspiring Values Democrats Club filed a Candidate Intention Statement on November 14, 2008 with the Secretary of State's Office. She recognizes and is very proud of the fact that in the Antelope Valley voters cast a majority of their votes to Democratic candidates.

Neighborhood houses will be established in strategically identified locations, which will allow City staff and resources to be more visible and

accessible where the need is strongest. Working together with local churches, schools and other organizations, these neighborhood houses will not only address the problems and opportunities unique to each neighborhood, but provide valuable assistance in the form of access to parenting classes, LA County services, housing rehabilitation programs, code enforcement, after school programs, neighborhood Watch and much, much more.

CAMPBELL FOUNDER~INSPIRING VALUES DEMOCRATS CLUB

In 2008 Mrs. Campbell entered the race for the office of the State Assembly, District 36, known at that time as "the red district" because of a 10-year Republican stronghold.

After months of campaigning it became clear that Democrats in district 36 were not motivated to vote. Less than 15% of registered Democratic population actually voted. Mrs. Campbell turned her immediate attention to organizing and encouraging Democratic voters.

Mrs Campbell launched the Inspiring Values Democrat Club (IVDC) on May 30, 2008, only 3 days before the Primary Election Day, of June 3, 2008.

The IVDC was subsequently chartered by the Los Angeles County Democratic Club (LACDP) on June 10, 2008.

Under Mrs. Campbell's advisement and organizational efforts, the IVDC held its 1st Annual Installation of Executive Board of Directors on October 17, 2008. Ten members were officially sworn in including her husband Alvin Campbell as the IVDC's first President.



Darren Parker, Regional 1 Vice Chair / LACDP and Key Note Speaker, performed the official ceremony in front of approximately 100 supporters. Elder Terence Hughes Assistant Pastor of Total Deliverance Church in Palmdale delivered an Inspirational speech.



Terrence Montgomery Vice Chair LACDP, presented the official charter certificate for the IVDC to Mrs. Campbell.

Reginald Sawyer, Sec. CA Democratic Party and Sandy Corrales-Eneix, Palmdale School Board President delivered motivational speeches.

Mrs. Maggie Campbell has dedicated her leadership and organizational skills to organizing the Democrats in District 36 and encourages democrats to vote. Her target goal is to reach no less than 95% voter participation by the 2010 elections.
