To provide comprehensive services to improve the academic success and the social emotional well being of Neglected or Delinquent Youth .



Program Description

The Neglected or Delinquent (N or D) Youth Program provides instructional and counseling support services to students in LAUSD who reside in group homes and/or are on probation and are transitioning from juvenile detention centers . N or D staff are housed in select schools, hospitals and shelters, as well as, in our local district and central offices.



Program Goals

- √ Improve academic achievement
- √ Ensure successful transition of students from camps to schools
- √ Ensure successful transition of students from high school to post secondary education and/or employment
- √ Drop out prevention
- √ Engage caregivers, parents and community partners in the educational process

We Serve...

- Students residing in juvenile camps, juvenile halls and residential placements
- Students returning from juvenile camps, juvenile halls and residential placements
- Schools (Local districts, school administrators, foster care school-site advocates, teachers and support staff)
- Caregivers and biological parents
- Local service providers (i.e., Group homes, Foster Family Agencies, Department of Probation, Department of Children & Family Services (DCFS) and community agencies)

Program Services

Instructional Support

Extended Day Tutors

- Academic tutoring and Pre/Post testing to measure progress for students in group homes collaborating with N or D

Teacher Assistants

- Assist teachers at participating school sites, shelters and hospitals

Counseling Support

Pupil Services & Attendance Counselors and Psychiatric Social Workers

- Transition planning services
- Individual and group counseling
- Case management
- Appropriate school placement
- Serve as a liaison between group homes, DCFS/Probation, schools and families
- Provide training on guidelines and policies for students in out-of-home care
- Refer to district and community resources
