Directions: From the 210 and 134 freeways: Exit at Fair Oaks/Marengo, turn south on Fair Oaks, left on Walnut to Raymond. From the 110 (Harbor): Drive north until the freeway ends at Arroyo Parkway. Drive north to Colorado, left on Colorado, right on Raymond (2 blocks). By Metro: Take the Gold line to the Memorial Park Station, which will drop you off right near the beginning of the parade. For a nice walk, the Del Mar station (on Raymond) is a bit further, but is also very close.
