On March 16, 2003, Rachel Corrie, a 23-year-old American college student, was killed by an Israeli bulldozer while protesting the destruction of Palestinian homes in the Gaza Strip. “My Name is Rachel Corrie” is a one-woman play composed from Rachel’s own journals, letters and emails from her early childhood until the days immediately before her death. Since its three sold-out runs at London’s Royal Court Theatre, the play has been surrounded by both controversy and impassioned proponents.
