## Conference Summary

The 2010 Mental Health Advocacy conference is a two-day event that serves both as a vehicle for challenging stigma and discrimination associated with mental illness, and as a forum for learning, sharing and building strategies to eliminate these while promoting dignity for clients and family members.

Over four hundred (400) attendees from across California will participate in learning about the dilemma of stigma and discrimination associated with mental illness from national leaders. They will join in sharing their skills and planning advocacy strategies and advancing the work that challenges stigma in every community. National experts will inform attendees with leading research and nuanced discussion of the shape of stigma and how to challenge it in diverse communities. Legal experts and public health attorneys will contribute understanding of the interface of civil protections and discrimination. Daily workshops will empower participants with hands-on skills and tools for confronting stigma and reducing discrimination in areas of housing, employment, relationships and other important domains of living, developing and embracing a human dignity and social justice agenda to support the wellness of all individuals.

The Conference will also include recognition for special achievement in challenging stigma and advocacy for citizens of Los Angeles and California communities who have made a difference in many people's lives through their efforts to champion mental health causes and the rights and dignity of those affected by mental illnesses.

The conference will feature exciting and inspirational work such as that of **Patrick Corrigan**, one of the world's foremost researchers in the area of mental health stigma, **Gayathri Ramprasad**, whose personal story, energy and courage are challenging stigma and the conspiracy of silence and shame internationally. It will be capped by a discussion and interactive session on the innovative "**Minds on the Edge**" program, broadcast on national PBS, as a means of building dialogue, understanding and action to develop humane, positive responses to mental health crisis.

### STIGMA ELIMINATION AND ANTI-DISCRIMINATION WORKSHOPS

Twenty-Four (24) Stigma and Discrimination Workshops are provided keyed to themes of A) Public Stigma, B) Individual Stigma and C) Systematic Stigma and Discrimination. Each of the three Workshop sessions will feature eight (8) trainings to choose from, developed with California subject experts especially for Advocacy Conference 2010.

#### APRIL 15— Mental Health Advocacy Awards Banquet with Assembly Member Chesbro

A special dinner with California Assembly Member Wesley Chesbro (D— North Coast) will recognize his work and leadership in advancing California legislation that has instituted remedies for discriminatory practices in our public health and legal systems. This event will raise awareness and funds for the California Memorial Project, which Mr. Chesbro effected through his work in the legislature, to counter decades of discrimination by identifying the names and remains and establishing dignified memorials for the thousands of individuals buried in unmarked graves on the grounds of California's state mental hospitals.
