SAFE MEDICATION DISPOSAL

Flushing expired or unwanted medicine down the drain or throwing them in the trash may harm our environment. Wastewater treatment cannot remove all of the medicine from our water system.

Expired or unwanted medication which is in your home could be stolen or abused by others.

With your help, our Safe Medication Disposal event will protect our community and our environment. Drop off any prescriptions, over the counter medicines, or veterinary medication to the event for a safe way to have these medications disposed of.

Syringes and medical equipment will NOT be accepted.

PERSONAL DOCUMENT DESTRUCTION

We will accept:

- · All types of paper. (Staples and paper clips are OK)
- · Empty binders.
- $\cdot \ \mathsf{Unwanted/expired} \ \mathsf{credit} \ \mathsf{cards}.$
- · Computer disks

Bring up to five boxes of your personal papers and we'll shred them for FREE! You must drive up and not walk in with

materials to be shredded.

Only 5 boxes of papers maximum per car! Although boxes vary in size, a typical paper box (11"x 12"x 15") is best, but as long as it can be removed by hand from your vehicle, we will accept it. If the paper comes in plastic bags, it will be accepted also.

You will be provided with a Certificate of Destruction by the Sheriff's Department during this event. Due to the large volume of vehicle traffic, you will not be able to sit and watch your documents as they are

being destroyed. Please rest assured that the Sheriff's Department and City are ensuring the proper destruction of your personal documents through a licensed and bonded document disposal company.

ELECTRONIC WASTE DISPOSAL

Most electronic items will be accepted at this event FREE OF CHARGE.

These include:

Computer equipment: Computers, Laptops, Keyboards, Printers, Scanners, Cables, Mouses.

Televisions, Computer Monitors, Flat Screens

Consumer Electronics: VCR's, Tape Players, DVD players, Radios,

Cell Phones, PDA's

Sorry, we will not be able to take appliances, engines, batteries, household hazardous waste, light bulbs, or any other materials not listed above at this event.
