## TOY GUNS DO KILL!

Over 30,000 Americans are killed each year by guns. Every three hours a young person dies from gunshots! No other industrialized country has as high a death rate from guns as does the United States. Yet while we spend millions of dollars to prevent diseases, placing restrictions on smoking, or trying to increase the safety of our cars, we are not doing enough to control guns.

There are now nearly 300 million guns in U.S., almost one for every man, woman and child. Gun laws are being loosened in spite of tragedies at Columbine and Virginia Tech. People will carry guns to Starbucks, into national parks, and in Arizona even into bars. Yet in the face of this growing threat, Congress is afraid to pass new gun control legislation, afraid of the NRA, and our Supreme Court seems only too eager to even further loosen gun laws.

In the face of this national passion with guns, Dr Farideh Kioumehr-Dadsetan, a prominent epidemiologist, is challenging the status quo in a grassroots campaign to educate children against toy guns and violence. Her work has attracted international attention and has earned her the American Public Health Association's Peace Award. Dr. Kioumehr-Dadsetan is the president of the International Health & Epidemiology Research Center (<a href="www.iherc.org">www.iherc.org</a>) in Los Angeles which operates a comprehensive violence prevention/intervention project that strives to eliminate mortality and morbidity in children and youth by influencing children's learned responses at an early age. Started in 1994, this campaign educates and raises awareness about the hazards of guns, toy guns/weapons, violent video games, and violence among children, parents, and educators and is accomplished in a variety of ways, including presentations, workshops, art works, letter writing, influencing toy manufacturers and policy makers, petitions, billboards, and other means.

We are proud to have Dr. Kioumehr-Dadsetan speak to us on this crucial topic. Please join us on May 19th at the Thousand Oaks Library.

A question and answer period will follow the presentation. The program is free and open to the public.
