UCLA Professor David Kaye (J.D. UC Berkeley, 1995) will discuss the International Criminal Court (ICC), inaugurated in The Hague, Netherlands, in 2002.

The ICC was established to resolve disputes involving crimes against humanity, genocide and war crimes and steps in only when a national court is unable or unwilling to prosecute its own citizens accused of such crimes. Although there are 108 member countries, because the U.S. has not joined the ICC, it is not in the position to control or influence the ICC's policies and decisions.

David Kaye is an adjunct professor at the UCLA School of Law and is the Executive Director of their International Human Rights Program, and was raised in the Conejo Valley. He has worked in the U.S. Department of State and the U.S. Embassy at the Hague. He has advised and written about issues and conflicts involving Darfur, Chechnya, the Balkans, India, Pakistan, Afghanistan, and policies regarding Cuba.
