What: California Barack Obama activists road-tripping to Nevada in support of our Early State neighbors!

When: Currently, we are asking all volunteers to participate in one of two trips (or both!). The dates for the trips are below:

<u>Trip 1</u>: Friday, December 14th - Sunday, December 16th <u>Trip 2</u>: Thursday, December 27th - Wednesday, January 2nd

Where: All Northern California volunteers will be heading to the Reno or Carson City Headquarters. All Southern California volunteers will work out of the Las Vegas Headquarters.

Frequently Asked Questions

•Where do we stay in Nevada?

Volunteers have two housing options in Nevada: *supporter housing* and *discounted hotel rates*. <u>Supporter housing</u> allows you to stay at a local Barack Obama supporter's home. There are no guarantees of luxurious accommodations, but you will have a place to sleep at night! If you choose this option, please bring a sleeping bag and pillow. <u>Note: Because you will be staying in somebody's home, please be prepared to treat the supporter's home respectfully (e.g. be mindful of when you are coming and going, noise, etc.)</u>

Alternatively, *discounted hotel rates* are available for Trip 1 at the Extended Stay America on E. Flamingo Street. The nightly rate is \$80 per room (rooms can hold up to 6 people). Make sure to mention that you are with the Barack Obama campaign. Space is extremely limited, so call 702-731-3111 to reserve your room today!

• What will we be doing in Nevada?

Volunteers spend their trips becoming immersed in the campaign's fast-paced and exciting field program—primarily through participating in traditional canvassing and phone-banking activities. Volunteers are paired with local Nevada activists, and are sure to make a few new friends while making a meaningful contribution to the campaign! Additionally, the trips serve as a valuable opportunity for new and veteran activists alike to develop and refresh fundamental campaign skills.

• How do we get to Nevada?

Volunteers are asked to arrange their own transportation (e.g., carpools!). For each of these trips you will be traveling with fellow volunteers from your area, so arranging a carpool should be pretty easy. Please contact your CD Team Coordinator for questions concerning carpool times and/or locations in your area.

• Why Nevada?

Nevada's status as one of the country's four early primary states makes it unusually significant in determining the presidential nominee. Nevada's significance is further heightened because it is a caucus state (and because caucuses have lower turnout levels). Therefore, each Barack Obama supporter we can identify is **huge**! Your presence in Nevada is one of the easiest and most immediate ways to make an impact in the primary election.
