U. S. Office of Personnel Management.

- <http://www.usajobs.opm.gov/>. Features thousands of government jobs, enables creation of resume and features other Federal employers' job opportunities. Enables search by type of job, occupational code, agency and state, as well as student, summer and part-time employment. Provides an opportunity to search for positions that are hard-to-fill or for positions where many applicants are needed. Offers chance to search career opportunities at specific agencies. Furnishes links to other employer job opportunities such as America's Job Bank, AmeriCorps, Federal Aviation Administration, Los Angeles Air Force Base, Space and Missiles Center, National Credit Union Administration, National Gallery of Art, National Labor Relations Board, Naval Sea Systems Command, Norfolk Naval Shipyard, U. S. Customs Service, U. S. Marine Corps Advanced Amphibious Assault and various Federal agencies.

Customer Support Office – Columbus (CSO-C).

- <http://www.hr.dla.mil>. Enables searching for vacant Federal government positions of organizations serviced by the CSO-C, developing resumes and self-nominating for positions individuals believe they are qualified and are interested in applying.
